

### **To the authors:**

The articles sent to *Direito em Movimento* will be submitted to the editorial board and two official reviewers.

The editorial board holds the right to suggest format changes, with the objective of making the articles suitable under the official review requirements and guidelines.

The footnotes and literature references must be restricted to the minimum possible. The publishing of an article doesn't display the board's agreement towards any statements made by the authors.

The articles must contain a maximum of 25 pages. The acceptance of articles that do not abide by this guideline, is up to Editorial Board's discretion.

All the articles will be submitted to two reviewers (**double-blind**). In case of disagreement between these reviewers, the articles will be submitted to a third one.

Until 2022, *Revista Direito em Movimento* accepts submissions from masters and PhDs.

Starting in 2022, submissions from masters and PhD students will be accepted in co-authorship with PhDs.

**Articles should strictly observe the standards below:

### **1. Article Format and Submission**

Authors must [register](#) to submit an article. If already registered, the author may [access](#) the system and begin the submission process.

Authors must include information such as; personal information ( the authors' first and last name), contact information (e-mail addresses, telephone numbers and mailing address) and their resume (curriculum lattes, orcid ID or others). **This is essential for publication.**

**1.1.** The articles must be presented electronically and be compatible with Word for Windows.

**1.2.** Arial Font, size 12 font, spacing 1.5.

**1.3.** Margins: top 3 cm, left 3 cm, bottom 2 cm, right 2 cm.

**1.4.** Usage of **bold** letters for headings and subheadings. Usage of *italicized* letters for quotations.

**1.5.** Text alignment: use full justification in order to align both the left and the right margins.

**1.6.** The articles must include:

- a. Title in the primary language of the author (Portuguese, Spanish, French or English).
- b. Abstract in both the primary language and one other language (Portuguese, Spanish, French or English).
- c. Keywords (5 at the most) in two different languages. (Portuguese, Spanish, French or English).

Note: author's information (name, institutional affiliation, address, e-mail, etc) should not be included in the article. These will be entered in Step 2 of the online submission.

**1.7.** Footnotes should be included at the bottom of the page, ordered by Arabic numerals; Arial font, size 10 font.

**1.8.** The pages must not be numbered.

## **2. Quotations**

**2.1.** Direct quote:

Up to three lines: must be enclosed within double quotation (“ ”) marks in the body of the text. The single quotation marks (‘ ’) are used only to indicate a quote within the quote.

More than three lines: must have a 4 cm indentation from the left margin, smaller font than text (size 10 font), must be single spaced and without quotation marks. At the end of the quote, the submitter must include in parenthesis: the last name of the author of the quote in capital letters, year of the work and page number. Example:

Bibliographic research is the first step in a scientific work. Through it it is possible to collect and verify the theoretical part on the themes and subjects that will be of interest in the progress of scientific work (PEREIRA, 2001, p. 19)

## **3. References**

Only the references of works mentioned in the article should be presented, in alphabetical order by author's last name, single spaced, size 12 font, without indentation, fully justified text alignment, with a single space between each reference, preceded by the title '**REFERENCES**', centered, in **bold** and with size 12 font:

Book (1 author): LAST NAME, First name. **Title**: Subtitle. *Edition*. Location: Publisher, year of publication.

Book (2 ou 3 authors): LAST NAME, First Name. LAST NAME, First Name. LAST NAME, First Name. **Title**. *Edition*. Location: Publisher, year of publication.

Book (more than 3 authors): LAST NAME, First Name *et al.* **Title**. *Edition*. Location: Publisher, year of publication.

Journal articles (signed): LAST NAME, First name. Title of the article. *Journal Title*, City, v. [volume], n. [number], p. [page], months and year.

Journal articles (unsigned): TITLE of the article. *Journal Title*, City, v. [volume], n. [number], p. [page], months and year.

Newspaper articles (signed): LAST NAME, First name. Title of the article. *Newspaper title*, City, months and year, Section/part, page(s).

Newspaper articles (unsigned): TITLE of the article. *Newspaper title*, City, months and year, Section/part, page(s).

Book Chapter: Last name, First name. Chapter Title In: AUTHOR. *Book Title*: Subtitle. Location: Publisher, year of publication, p. xxx-xxx.

Dissertation / Thesis: LAST NAME, First name. *Title*. Year of deposit (delivery). N. of pages. Thesis / Dissertation / Course Conclusion Paper (Doctorate / Master / Undergraduate) - Teaching Unit, Institution, Venue, year of defense.

Electronic journal article: LAST NAME, First name. Title of the article. *Journal Title*, City, v. [volume], n. [number], p. [page], months and year. Available at: [www.site.com.br](http://www.site.com.br). Accessed on: month day year.

eBook: LAST NAME, First name. *Title*: Subtitle. Place: Publisher, date of publication. eBook Available at: [www.site.com.br](http://www.site.com.br). Accessed on: month day year.

Legislation: Jurisdiction (country, state, city). Law no., month day year. Month day year from the publication that released the legislation.

Online legislation: Jurisdiction (country, state, city). Law no., month day year. Available in: <<http://website address>>. Accessed in: day, month and year.

Summaries, Judgments, etc.: Jurisdiction. Competent Judicial Body. Title (nature of the decision or menu). Number (if any). Parties involved (if any). Rapporteur: Name of the Rapporteur. Place, month day year. Informations about the publication that released the judgment (if online, place as in the previous example).

#### **4. Body of the Text**

**4.1** The author of the article is responsible for its contents.

**4.2** The editorial board of “*Revista Direito em Movimento*” holds the right to make any necessary changes to the articles in order adapt them to the publishing formal requirements and guidelines. Any substantial changes will only be made with the author’s consent.

**4.3** Submission to other outlets is allowed, as long as it’s mentioned that they were originally published in “Direito em Movimento” first.

#### **5. Publication agenda**

**5.1** *Revista Direito em Movimento* is published semiannually but receives articles continuously throughout the year.

#### **6. Article selection**

**6.1** The criteria to be evaluated are: the originality of the theme, the quality of the methodology used, the text cohesiveness and whether the authors abided by the review’s editorial official requirements and guidelines.

**6.2** The authors will be informed of any recommendations made by the reviewers and of the final report.
